*Fannie Lou Hamer's testimony before the Credentials Committee of the 1964 Democratic Convention exposed to the nation the tactics and brutality that were employed to prevent African Americans from voting. She was part of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party, which protested Mississippi's segregationist delegate slate at the nominating convention in Atlantic City. While the alternate delegate slate presented by the MFDP was not fully recognized at that time, the Democratic Party agreed to make changes for future conventions. The efforts of the MFDP and Mrs. Hamer's speeches around the country changed the character of the Democratic Party, and increased support for the passage of the Voting Rights Act of 1965.
